Our network of food pantries and meal sites has seen a nearly 40% increase in children, families and seniors seeking help compared to last year. The feedback from staff on the frontline is clear – the high costs of living, in particular high housing costs and increasing food prices, are putting a significant strain on local family budgets and driving tough decisions around nutrition.

Now in its 51st year of essential service to the community that bears its name, South Milwaukee Human Concerns (SMHC) is a decades long and steadfast partner of Hunger Task Force. Serving nearly one-third of South Milwaukee residents each year, SMHC offers healthy and hearty food options through the support of Hunger Task Force.

"What we can offer our clients through our work with Hunger Task Force is the critical link to sustaining efforts with our thousands of clients," said Deb DeBoer, SMHC director. "We are not just a partner with Hunger Task Force, our relationship has evolved and grown into a lifeline for our clients as they navigate food insecurity."

Through ups and downs in the economy, personal difficulties and the volatile costs of groceries, SMHC is that safety net in times of need. SMHC's holistic

approach to addressing hunger is essential to building a more resilient and equitable community.

SMHC operates an emergency food pantry that serves more than 275 families monthly and 8,500 unique clients annually. It also offers men's, women's and children's clothing, basic household items, school supplies and modest holiday gifts for children of clients. SMHC's holistic approach to addressing the multiple facets of poverty is essential for building a more resilient and equitable community.



"Despite the increasing demand for our services, we manage to provide that critical help and hope to all who access us," adds DeBoer. "It's an ongoing challenge. Our partnership with Hunger Task Force helps us consistently meet the needs of those we serve."



Teaming Up to Combat **Food Insecurity**









For over 40 years, and especially during tough times, our hometown has united through Food For Families to support our neighbors in need. Hear from Matt King, CEO of Hunger Task Force and Brenna Holly, Senior Director of Corporate Philanthropy at Johnson Controls about this vital partnership and how you can get involved.



Why has Johnson Controls been a proud sponsor of Food For Families since 2006?

Brenna: Johnson Controls has been part of the Milwaukee community for 140 years and addressing food insecurity in our communities has been an important priority for both Johnson Controls and the Johnson Controls Foundation.



For the last 18 years now, we have had the privilege of joining forces with Hunger Task Force to call on local businesses, individuals and groups in our community to help support Milwaukee families during the holiday season. We really feel that Food for Families is an integral part of addressing the persistent issue of food insecurity in our community so we're proud to support the program.



Each year, we make a financial commitment to Hunger Task Force, host an onsite food collection and giving campaign for Johnson Controls employees and volunteer at Hunger Task Force.



For those who may not yet know, what is Food For Families?

Matt: Food For Families is a tradition in the Milwaukee community. People from across the area step up to give – food or funds – and become a part of the solution to end hunger. As Milwaukee's Free & Local food bank, Hunger Task Force delivers all food donations free of charge to our network of food pantries, meal sites, homeless shelters and low-income senior centers.



How can the Milwaukee community join Johnson Controls in supporting Food For Families this holiday season?

Matt: Through Food For Families, people can participate in food drives, whether they are in-person collections or virtual fundraisers, to help us provide nutritious holiday meals. When people donate, we use the dollars to purchase healthy and culturally relevant items - in bulk - to maximize our buying power and provide even more pantry staples and holiday foods.

Brenna: We'd love to see other companies and organizations join us by hosting their own online giving campaign and/or in-person food drive this season. In honor of Hunger Task Force's 50th anniversary, it would be great to have the most successful Food For Families season in history! Together, we can make a significant impact for families in our community.

Hunger Task Force takes the guess work out of supporting Food For Families by providing donation boxes and setting up your virtual food drive page and sending you a link. Each year, we do both an onsite food drive as well as a virtual giving campaign. That way, our in-office employees can give directly when they're on-site and our staff who might be working remotely can also participate virtually.



How does Food For Families positively impact the lives of children, families and seniors during the holiday season?

Matt: Right now, in our community, we're seeing a 40% increase in visits to local food pantries within our network compared to last year. We have relied on Food For Families to feed those in need in Milwaukee for 18 years, and it really takes involvement from our neighbors to make sure that local children, families and seniors get the nutritious foods they need and deserve. The holidays are a time when we reflect on the blessings that we have in our life and make sure that others have some of the same experiences – like a family meal.

- 1. This past summer, the "Cooking with Culture" program immersed Milwaukee kids in hands-on learning at The Farm. Over six weeks, students harvested fresh produce from the School Garden, learned from our farmers and developed culinary skills in the demonstration kitchen.
- Piggly Wiggly, our generous donors and over 200 volunteers, the Piggly Wiggly \$5 Day raised nearly 40,000 lbs. of healthy food and thousands in cash donations to help feed our neighbors in need during Opening Day at the Wisconsin State Fair.
- The Hunger Task Force Farm was honored with the Brewers Community Foundation Public Space Award and Wells Fargo People's Choice Award at the 25th Annual MANDI Awards dinner held on August 15 at the Baird Center.
