



## Income Eligibility Table

## Commodity Supplemental Food Program (CSFP)

Effective: **March 7<sup>th</sup>, 2025**: Based on **150%** of the US Dept. of **2025** Health and Human Services Poverty Guidelines.

**Use total gross income – before taxes and deductions - of ALL household members.**

Every 60+ year-old household member is eligible to receive their own monthly food package.

**Adjunctive Eligibility:** an applicant can be adjunctively eligible if they provide proof/documentation that they are certified and fully eligible for the following Federal programs:

- Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) known as FoodShare in Wisconsin.
- Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations (FDPIR)
- Supplemental Security Income (SSI)
- Low Income Subsidy Program
- Medicare Savings Programs.

**Applicants who are adjunctively income eligible, as set forth in the above section, shall not be subject to the income limits established.**

*For additional income screening information see the Wisconsin CSFP Daily Operations Guide. Pursuant to program regulations, the 2025 income guidelines are effective upon receipt from the USDA and will remain in effect until notification of the income guidelines for 2026.*

### To calculate monthly income

Weekly	Multiply by 4.3
Bi-weekly (every 2 weeks)	Multiply by 2.15
Semi-monthly (2 per month)	Multiply by 2
Lump sums	Divide by 12

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
